# Property Committee Meeting Minutes

Date: June 2, 2026

Committee members attending: Randy Rackness, Chairman, Duane Svakstad, Mark Wientjes, Darwin Carlson, Don Farthing, Cory Mushi, Dick Nicolai, Other attending: Pastor Craig, Pastor Janine, Earl Benson, Lori Storley

## 1. Opening Prayer by Pastor Janine

## 2. Presentation: Pye-Barker Fire Safety Proposal

Presenter: Susie Hudson, Pye-Barker Fire & Safety

### Key Points

Pye-Barker proposes to replace services currently provided by Banco, Justice, and Xtreme, consolidating all inspections and monitoring under one company.

Susie emphasized Pye-Barker's local presence, national scale, and ability to service Edwards fire alarm systems, which the church uses.

She highlighted significant cost savings, especially reducing fire-extinguisher inspection fees from \$6.50 to \$2.75 each.

A new cell dialer is required (one-time cost: \$375).

Annual monitoring fee: \$540.

Pye-Barker technicians can perform sprinkler, alarm, hood, and extinguisher inspections in coordinated visits to avoid multiple trip charges.

### Committee Questions

Members raised several technical questions requiring follow-up with Pye-Barker technician Tanner, including:

Whether the system will use internet + cellular or cellular only.

Whether the system performs daily/regular communication health checks.

Whether trouble alerts will still identify specific zones/sensors, as Banco currently does.

Identity of the third-party monitoring company.

Susie will connect Tanner with Pye-Barker to answer these questions directly.

## 3. Cost Comparison Discussion of Pye-Barker Proposal

Committee noted that in 2025, the church spent \$4,517 with Banco due to repeated trouble calls and technician visits.

Estimated annual cost with Pye-Barker appears closer to \$1,600, pending confirmation.

Committee agreed no decision can be made until Tanner answers all technical questions.

## 4. Construction & Restoration Updates by Lori

Lori provided updates on ongoing restoration work:

### Flooring

All flooring (sanctuary + fellowship hall) is scheduled for the week of June 15.

Some concerns remain about floor conditions and carpet placement around the back pew.

### Furniture & Fixtures

New office furniture delivered.

Blinds to be installed.

Countertop installers may be ready by Thursday.

### Other Items

AV booth carpet squares must remain removable for cable access.

Lori confirmed all ordered materials have been delivered.

The committee thanked Lori for her extensive work.

## **5. Stained Glass Windows**

**12 windows total; 8 reportedly complete.**

**Past installation was done by committee members, not the vendor.**

**ServiceMaster removed the windows but damaged some frames.**

**Committee prefers Gil Haugen or the stained-glass vendor—not ServiceMaster—to reinstall them.**

**Pastor Craig will email Nick and Chauncey to coordinate proper installation and supervision.**

## **6. Insurance & Budget Updates**

**Earl is working with Brotherhood Mutual regarding insufficient funds in the Thrivent account to pay outstanding invoices.**

**Landscaping and irrigation damage may require a separate claim; further clarification pending.**

**Irrigation system is likely damaged; the Tree Farm contractor will evaluate once construction equipment is removed.**

## **7. Cleanup Day & Re-Entry Timeline**

**Original cleanup date (June 6) postponed.**

**New proposed cleanup day: Saturday, June 27.**

**Thrivent Action Team funds approved; T-shirts distributed; \$250 card available for food.**

**Target date for returning to the sanctuary: Sunday, July 5 (tentative).**

**Outdoor worship will resume only after sanctuary re-entry.**

**Randy will coordinate cleanup day logistics.**

## **8. Flat Roof Inspection**

**Previous inspection (late fall) looked good.**

**Committee recommends another inspection soon, after construction is completed.**

**Chauncey may assist; Don and Duane will help evaluate.**

## **9. Electrical & AV Updates**

**Several change-order invoices from Englestad received:**

**\$1,100 – Sound booth work**

**\$425 – Wi-Fi conduit**

**\$2,300 – AV conduits and junction box**

**These are not fire-related and will be paid by the church.**

**Water was discovered in under-floor conduits; ServiceMaster vacuumed out 18 gallons total.**

## **10. Pest Control**

**Committee agreed to resume Sodak Pest Control after restoration is complete.**

**Bat-control warranty remains valid for the life of the roof.**

## **11. Landscaping**

**Weeding and plant maintenance will be included in the June 27 cleanup day.**

**Some dead shrubs and grass will need replacement.**

**Herbicide options discussed; care must be taken around living plants.**

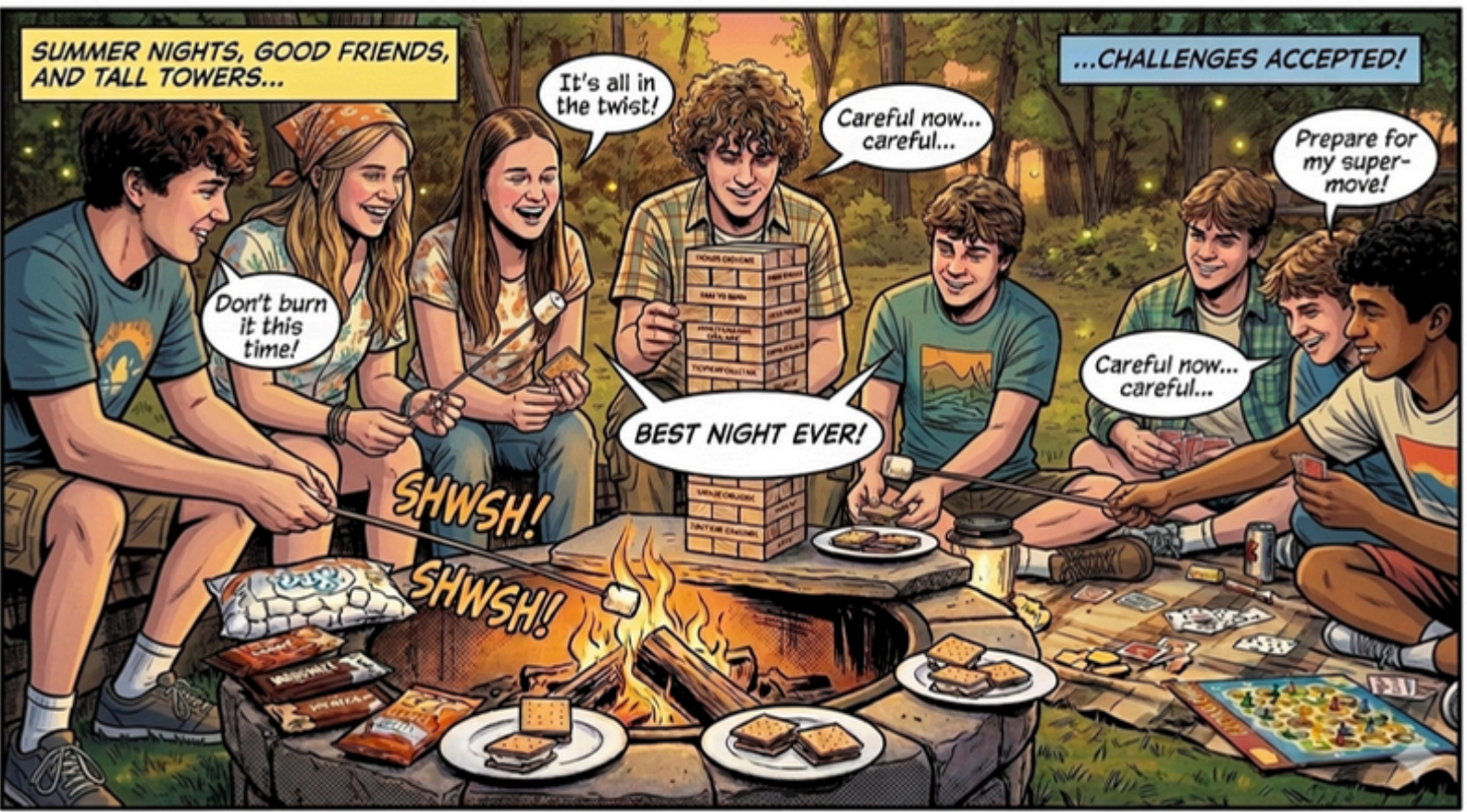
## **12. Next Meeting**

# Listening for the Promise Weekly Devotional

Third Sunday after Pentecost (Proper 6) – June 14, 2026

“And proclaim as you go, saying, ‘The kingdom of heaven is at hand.’ . . . You received without paying; give without pay.”

– Matthew 10:7-8 –

It’s almost officially summer! Oh, the wonderful sights and sounds of children playing, outdoor concerts, fireworks, and a host of late-night symphonies comprised of a plethora of insects. We are reminded of all God’s creation as we travel throughout the summer months; the earth is once again rich in vibrant colors. It is indeed the beginning of a new season and a natural time for growth.

We are now into the Season after Pentecost – a time to grow and mature in our faith as disciples of Christ and to live out the ministries the Spirit has empowered us with. Are you ready to follow the prompting and guiding of the Holy Spirit to live out God’s will for your life?

In Exodus 19:7-8 we learn that, “Moses came and called the elders of the people and set before them all these words that the Lord had commanded him. All the people answered together and said, ‘All that the Lord has spoken we will do.’”

Imagine hearing their resounding, “Yes, we will do as you have commanded!” These people were on fire to do God’s work! Are you?

So, how do we go about proclaiming, “The kingdom of heaven is at hand?” Remember, we were commissioned by God and given all authority through the power of the Holy Spirit! And, because it was given freely to us, we should give freely to others! We are the ordinary people doing the extraordinary work of the Lord!

Psalm 100 is a beautiful verse to learn and a great way to proclaim God’s word: “Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.”

**The Kingdom is at hand! God’s love endures forever! Amen.**

## Pentecost3(Proper 6)

June 14, 2026



### Proclamation Points

The following are some thoughts and questions to be used for a text study on the weekly lessons, or for jump-starting the imagination of the preacher and hearer in preparing for the proclamation event.

What is original sin?

It is a propensity toward evil. It is a nausea toward the good, a loathing of light and wisdom, and a delight in error and darkness, a flight from and an abomination of all good works ...

### Exodus 19:2-8a

While Israel was camped out in the wilderness of Sinai, God summoned Moses up the mountain. The Lord said Moses while he was on the mountaintop that he should go down and remind the people that it was the Lord himself who had carried them out of Egypt, away from their oppressors, and brought them to himself. The image God uses was that of an eagle carrying his young on his wings. If they would follow the Lord in obedience and trust, he would make of them his treasured possession. This is the God who made heaven and earth and he is choosing them, out of all the nations of peoples on the earth.

• What is the significance of Israel camping at the foot of Sinai?

What will God do for them while they are in this place?

• God promised to make Israel a holy nation, a royal priesthood, if they would but live in obedience to him. What is their response? From what you know of the story of the Israelites in the wilderness, how long does their proud boasting last?

The Hebrew word in verse 5 that is translated as “treasured possession” is *segullah* (seg-ool-law). Literally it means “valuable property.” This word is only used eight times in the Old Testament, but it carries a significant meaning for God’s people. To belong to the Lord God, creator of all that exists, is to be a cherished and valuable person.

• How does knowing that God considers you his “treasured possession” give you confidence in your relationship with God? How does this description keep the relationship in the proper order?

### Psalm 100

The psalmist is joyful in the notion that he, along with all of Israel, are beloved sheep of the Lord’s pasture. This is cause for praise and thanksgiving to the one whose love is from of old and endures forever.

• Why do you think the psalmist exhorts the people to know that the Lord is God? Shouldn’t that be obvious? Why or why not?

Again in this psalm, human being are spoken of as God’s possession: “It is he who made us and we are his.”

• Is it good news or bad news to know that we do not “own” ourselves? What are the implications of this? (Compare with 1 Corinthians 6:19-20.)

Verse 2 says, “come into his presence...” Verse 4 says, “enter his gates ... and his courts.”

• In the Biblical days, what would this have been a reference to? As modern day Christians, when or where do we come into

God’s presence? How is that the same? How is that different?

### Romans 5:6-15

God’s timing is perfect. He is never too early and never too late. Paul proclaims that God’s timing for salvation was the right time as well. That time came “while we were still weak.” For sinners in need of redeeming, the Son came to earth in human form to reconcile us to the Father. Christ’s death shows us the depths of God’s love for us.

• Is this text saying that we make ourselves good enough to be redeemed? On whose goodness is God’s redemption based?

Paul makes the argument that one would scarcely die for a righteous person — meaning it *could* happen if the one who laid their life down was brave enough, bold enough and the one who was saved was worthy enough. It would be a rare occurrence indeed for one to die for someone who was deemed no good.

• What does all this say about who Jesus is?

• How does the blood that Jesus shed on the cross make us who are sinners into the righteous? Why would Jesus go to all that trouble?

### Matthew 9:35-10:8 [9-20]

The Gospel writer tells us that as Jesus traveled around visiting cities, towns, and synagogues, he ran into a lot of people who were sick and lost. Scripture says, “He had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd” (Matthew 9:6).

• How are humans like sheep in that we need someone we can trust to follow? Why do we so easily get lost?

Jesus sent his disciples out into the surrounding areas to heal, cast out demons, and have compassion on people the way that he did. There was a great need for laborers, Jesus said, but there are few who are willing to do the work. The work is hard, and it is risky; it can be dangerous and hostile.

• Shepherds often use border collies to assist in their work. What do these trained dogs have in common with the shepherd?

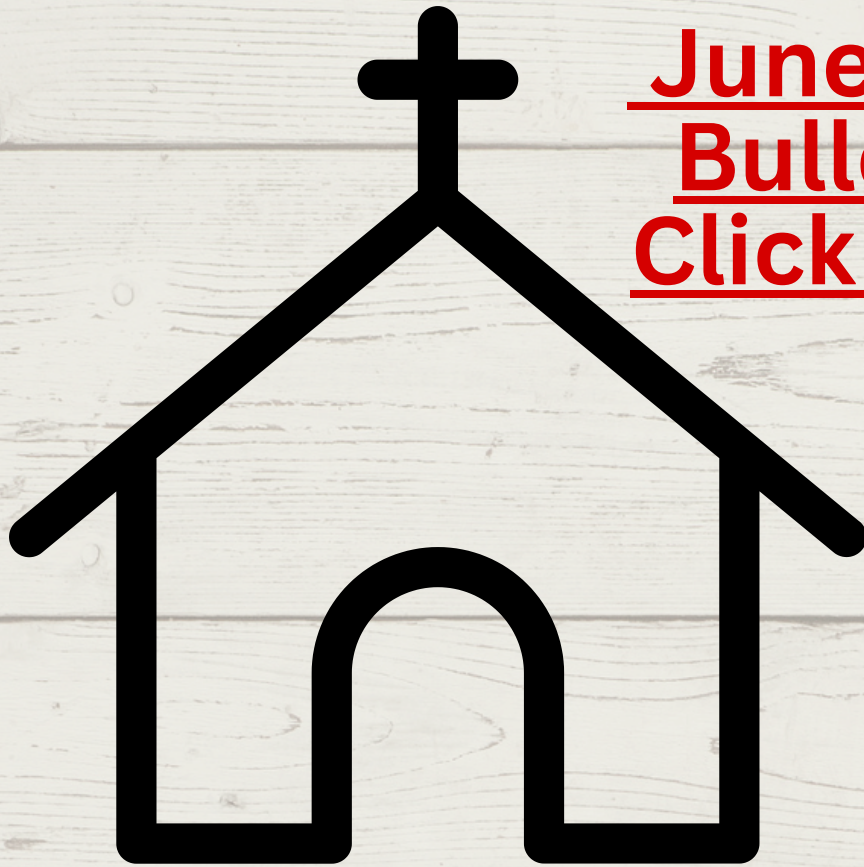
What do they have in common with the sheep? Jesus told the disciples not to take anything extra with them, so that they would have to depend on hospitality and support from outside themselves.

• Why is it so hard for us to trust that Jesus will give us all we need for the day, and all we need to do his kingdom work? What “faith lesson” was Jesus teaching them?

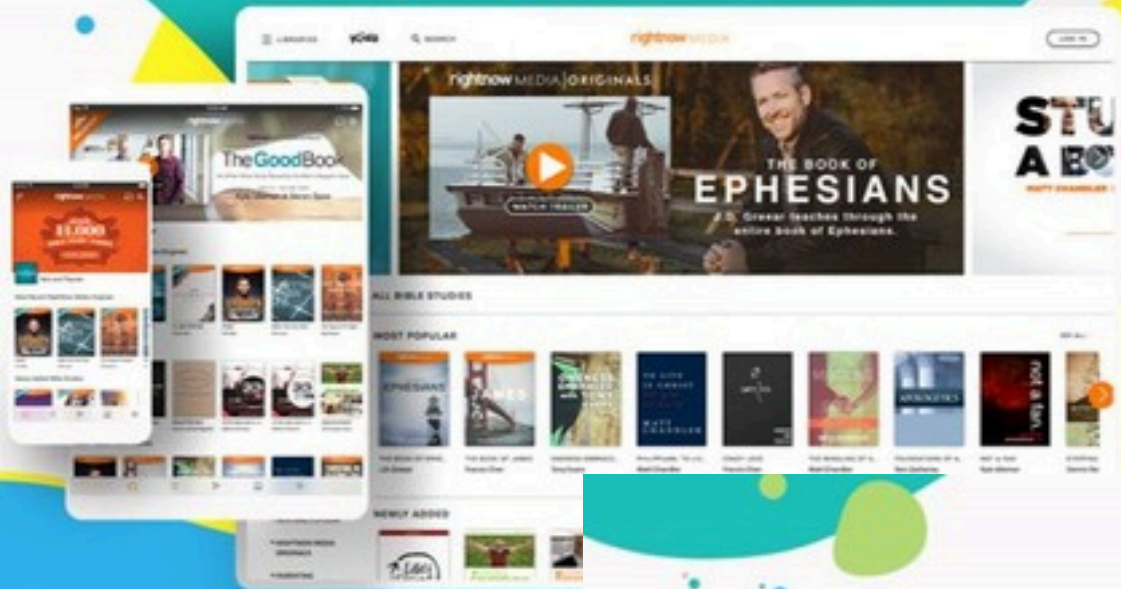

## **Align With God in 2024**

”So that the works of God might be displayed.”

In John 9 we read about one of Jesus’ miracles where he restored the sight of a blind man. At the beginning of the story, we see the disciples questioning Jesus about who had sinned to cause the blind man his disability.

Rather patiently (we might imagine), Jesus insinuates that the disciples are asking the wrong question. He encourages them to look forward, ‘while it is still day,’ (v4) rather than backward upon who to blame.

What are you looking forward to this new year? Right now, it feels like the world is full of suffering and poverty of spirit and unity. In this passage, Jesus teaches us that with suffering comes the opportunity for God’s works to be displayed.

Children growing up in the slums are suffering because they are neglected and failed by a wider community that is unable to care for their physical needs and education. By supporting CBC you have the opportunity to step in as the healing hands and feet of Jesus.

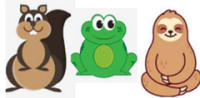
